



10 Steps to implementing LIONS QUEST in your country*

Step 1: Contact the Lions Quest program at the Lions Clubs International Foundation to indicate interest in setting up a Lions Quest program in your country. (Please contact Matthew Kiefer at matthew.kiefer@lionsclubs.org)

Step 2: All stakeholders (Lions, educators, government officials, funders, etc.) need to assess whether the program will be suitable for local implementation. (This can be done through assessment of the curriculum or attendance at a workshop in another country).

Step 3: When there is a consensus regarding the suitability of the program, evidence must be provided by all stakeholders to indicate interest (such as a letter of endorsement).

Step 4: A Steering Committee should be formed and an initial implementation plan shared with the Lions Quest Department at the Lions Clubs International Foundation.

Step 5: A Preliminary Memorandum of Agreement must be signed with LCIF.

Step 6: Funding should be secured for a pilot workshop.

Step 7: A Translation and Adaptation Committee should be formed by the Steering Committee.

Step 8: The Translation and Adaptation Committee undertakes an initial translation of the curricula. (If a translation is not needed such as when the pilot workshop can be carried out in English, this step can be skipped.)

Step 9: Contact LCIF to have a Senior Trainer assigned to train the first group of teachers in the pilot workshop.

Step 10: Conduct the Pilot Workshop.
