



Rules for the Lions Quest Heroes in the Community Contest

1. Eligibility/Exclusions

This contest is open to all U.S. Lions Quest trained educators, their students and U.S. Lions clubs. Service project entries must be completed through a joint effort between a U.S. Lions Quest classroom and U.S. Lions club, supported by a Lions Quest trained teacher. The International Board of Directors and their families, Past International Presidents and their families, employees of Lions Clubs International and Lions Clubs International Foundation, and their families, are excluded. Void where prohibited or restricted by law.

2. Entry Instructions

To enter the contest, eligible contestants must submit an application to Lions Quest, 300 W. 22nd Street, Oak Brook, IL 60523, or via e-mail to sandy.olear@lionsclubs.org. Applications can be downloaded from www.lions-quest.org. Hard copies can be requested from Lions Quest, 630-468-6960. Projects must be completed and summaries received by Lions Quest no later than March 16, 2010. Submissions to include project outcomes, photos and/or video, as outlined in submission guidelines below.

3. Submission Guidelines

Service projects must be completed between September 23, 2009 and March 16, 2010. All service projects must include participation from Lions Quest classroom students and a local Lions club. Completed project summaries with supporting photos/video are due to Lions Quest, 300 W. 22nd Street, Oak Brook, IL 60523, no later than March 16, 2010. Photos and/or video must be submitted on a CD or flash drive. Summaries will be uploaded to the Lions Quest Web site for public voting from March 23, 2010 through April 6, 2010. Project updates may be submitted to Lions Quest, sandy.olear@lionsclubs.org for placement on the Web site, or added to Lions Quest Facebook and Twitter pages throughout the planning and execution process. (Updates are not required for eligibility.)

4. Project Submissions

All project submissions, photos and video become the property of Lions Quest and Lions Clubs International Foundation and will not be returned. Lions Quest may use submissions in any way deemed suitable.

5. Winner Selection and Notification

The top six eligible entries will be selected through public voting on the Lions Quest Web site from March 23, 2010 through April 6, 2010. The top six entries will be eligible for the grand prize. Selection of the grand prize winner shall be chosen by the Lions Quest Advisory Committee. All winners will be announced on April 21, 2010. Contestants agree to publication and/or display of their names and likenesses to be made at the discretion of Lions Clubs International Foundation.

6. Waiver

As a condition of entering this contest, entrant agrees that: (1) under no circumstances will entrant be permitted to obtain awards for any losses or damages, and participant hereby waives all rights to claim punitive, incidental and consequential damages and any other damages, other than for actual out-of-pocket expenses, and waives any and all rights to have damages multiplied or otherwise increased; (2) any and all disputes, claims and causes of action arising out of or connected with this contest, or any prizes awarded, shall be resolved individually, without resort to any form of class action, and exclusively by arbitration; and (3) any and all claims, judgments and awards shall be limited to actual out-of-pocket cost association with entering this contest, but in no event attorneys fees. By accepting a prize, winner agrees to release LCI, its directors, officers, employees and agents, including without limitation its advertising and promotion agencies, from any and all liability, loss or damages arising out of or in connection with the awarding, receipt, use or misuses of the prize or participation in any prize-related activities.

Top five entries will receive: classroom pizza party for participating students (maximum of 30) and Lions Quest teacher; Lions club will receive certificate and Lions Quest banner patch.

8. Other Terms and Conditions

The decision of Lions Clubs International Foundation will be final in all matters pertaining to this contest. Lions Clubs International Foundation reserves the right to disqualify entries that violate the rules or interfere with the contest in any manner. Contestants accept all responsibility for late, lost, misdirected or illegible entries. Entries sent with insufficient postage will be disqualified. Lions Clubs International Foundation is not responsible for entries damaged, destroyed or lost during the judging process. Lions Clubs International Foundation may cancel the contest without notice at any time. The contest is void where prohibited, taxed or restricted by law. In the event that less than 6 project submissions are received, one project will be chosen as grand prize winner and the remaining entries will receive top project awards respectively. All projects will be recognized on the Lions Quest Web site. Winners will be recognized on the Lions Quest Web site, the Lions Clubs International Foundation Web site, and in The Lion magazine.
