COVER

- Lions Quest is a PreK through 12th grade Social and Emotional Learning program (often called SEL).
 - There is a separate set of teacher materials and Student Journal for each grade level PreK-8 and one high school (9-12) set of materials.
 - The program has been available for over 30 years and is used in over 90 countries around the world.

PAGE 1

- Lions Quest has an elementary program (*Skills for Growing*), middle school program (*Skills for Adolescence*), and high school program (*Skills for Action*).

PAGES 2-3

- Research shows that by teaching students SEL skills, classroom behavior and academic achievement improve.
- The program can be used in a variety of ways.
- The teacher training workshops not only provide the background and information needed to implement the program effectively, they also help teachers understand the benefits of taking the time to use the program.

PAGES 4-5

- The program is streamlined and easy-to-use – there are 3 components in the Teacher’s Curriculum Kit and a Student Journal (paperback).

PAGES 6-7

- The PreK-8 curriculum is divided into 6 Units with 3-8 lessons in each unit.
- Unit 1 begins by developing a positive classroom community and Units 2-3 focus on student SEL skills individually and in groups.
- Unit 4 covers drug, alcohol, and tobacco awareness.

- Unit 5 covers service-learning and Unit 6 allows students and teachers to reflect and evaluate their experience with the curriculum.

PAGES 8-23

- Pages 8-23 show a sample lesson from *Skills for Growing* (grade 3) and *Skills for Adolescence* (Grade 7).
 - Page 9 – each Unit has a 1-page opener that helps the teacher prepare for the upcoming lessons.
 - Pages 10-12 – each lesson is 3 pages, with 4 parts – Discovering, Connecting, Practicing, and Applying. The material in the side-columns helps teachers plan, extend, and enrich each lesson.
 - Page 13 – there are “Projectables” for whole-class presentations. They can be displayed or printed.
 - Page 14 – shows samples of the Student Journal activities for each lesson.
 - Page 15 –the Family Connection take-home worksheet helps the student make the home-school connection that is important in SEL instruction.

PAGES 24-25

- The high school program, *Skills for Action*, is organized a bit differently than PreK-8.
 - The Skills Bank which has SEL and study skills lessons.
 - There are 2 service-learning models for teachers to use if service-learning is a part of the curriculum

PAGES 26-31

- Contains a sample Skills Lesson and a Service-learning Lesson.

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- Each teacher/facilitator using the program needs a Teacher’s Curriculum Kit (\$150).
- Compared to other programs on the market Lions Quest is inexpensive.
